This summer marks the 5th anniversary of remarkable Alistair's neurosurgery at UCLA Medical Center under the magical care of Dr. Aria Fallah.

Making an almost impossible decision, his parents elected to pursue the complex removal of half of his brain (a hemispherectomy) to stay the ravages of early epilepsy and persistent seizures. Mom Sarah (a keen tennis enthusiast regularly seen around BOH) and dad Dan accompanied him to LA while his brother Atticus and sister Wilhelmina, extended family, and a veritable tribe of family friends donned their Alistair-Superman t-shirts in support during the 9+ hour surgery and lengthy recovery.
